began in Abbotsford in 1993. Our Constitution and By-laws were approved at the Annual General Meeting in Vancouver in 1994, and we were incorporated as a non-profit organization under the BC Societies Act on January 18, 1995.

BCGEHR's objectives are:

- ◇ To bring together handbell choirs from all parts of BC;
- ◇ To encourage the formation of new choirs on an inter-generational basis;
- ◇ To sponsor workshops for ringers and directors;
- ◇ To publish a regular newsletter, *Quarternotes*;
- ◇ To offer a variety of programs and services to support our members;
- ◇ To encourage all BCGEHR members to engage with and become members of the national handbell organization, Handbell Musicians of Canada (HMC). *Handbell Musicians of Canada (HMC), our newly incorporated national organization, features a revised model of membership and a modernized governance structure. The individual membership format makes HMC open to ALL Canadian handbell musicians offering true national representation. 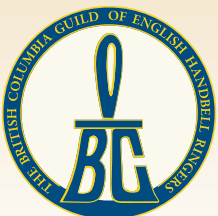
